Research Workshop of the Year

Call for applications

The University wishes to award the 'Research Workshop of the Year' prize to reward academic workshop activities of outstanding performance and impact, realised with high involvement, which cannot be rewarded under the Corvinus Research Excellence Prize.

The award may be applied for by research workshops and groups set up within or between institutes/departments and achieving outstanding performance in the given academic year, in one or more fields of the evaluation system.

Application conditions:

- the applying workshop consists of at least 3 people, who are the staff members of the University working as lecturers-researchers and PhD students
- the people applying as a workshop have a proved long-standing relationship and cooperation

The application should contain the following:

1. General introduction of the research workshop

- When and in which institute, department or research centre was the research workshop established
- Number of people in the workshop
- Research subject of the workshop
- Objective of the workshop

2. Presentation of one or several items from the following:

a) Strengthening the domestic and international academic embeddedness of the University

- 1. Domestic and international research applications submitted by the research workshop:
 - Number of submitted domestic and/or international research applications, type of participation (member, consortium leader), value of application
 - In the case of applications with international cooperation, the academic reputation of the participating partner institutions
 - Result of the assessment of the application
- 2. Successful international or domestic conference of national importance, organised by the research workshop and strengthening the international fame and reputation of the University:
 - Number of attendees at the conference
 - Diversity of the affiliation of the attendees
 - Academic reputation of keynote speakers
- 3. Researchers of international universities participating in the work of the research workshop:
 - Number and affiliation of the international researchers of the workshop, their academic reputation (e.g. number of Q1-Q2 articles), extent of their involvement in workshop activities

- Workshops, internal trainings, lectures organised by the workshop and realised with the involvement of acknowledged international researchers
- 4. Special editions published in prestigious Hungarian or international academic journals, edited by the research workshop

b) Research mentoring and knowledge sharing

- 1. Mentoring of young colleagues working in the research workshop:
 - Number of mentored young colleagues
 - Period of mentoring
 - Number and prestige of academic works submitted / produced as a result of the mentoring
- 2. Internal trainings organised by the research workshop, aimed at building the academic excellence of the Corvinus and sharing knowledge to help the change in culture:
 - Topic of internal trainings
 - Number of internal trainings
 - Number of attendees of internal trainings

c) Research impact

- 1. Activity to introduce the results of the research workshop on a large scale, innovative nature of disclosure:
 - Programme, lecture in the Researchers' Night
 - Number of news items posted in social media, diversity of platforms used, nature of posts, attributes of target audience reached (if such data is available)
 - Number and type of publications in non-technical journals, attributes of the target audience reached (if such data is available)
 - Number and type of academic educational round table discussions organised outside the walls of the university, attributes of the target audience reached (if such data is available)
- 2. Social impact of the results of the research workshop:
 - Take over, share and process contents made available by the research workshop
 - Adoption of an intellectual product or patent produced as a result of the research, by external actors
 - Cooperation with for-profit organisations for the practical implications of the research
 - Cooperation with non-profit organisations for the practical implications of the research

The prize is awarded by a jury of 6 members. The chairman of the jury is the Vice-Rector for Research, 2 members are delegated by the Board of Professors at the request of the Vice-Rector for Research, and the 6th member is the Head of Human Resources.

The prize comes with a certificate of merit and cash award.
