

Checking the Scopus profile

How do I find and check my author profile?

To check your author profile visit the [Scopus](#) website. Choose the 'Author' tab from the search menu and enter your name. It is worth searching for your last name in both fields (last name, first name).

Start exploring

If your profile is correct:

Great! You can take a look at who cite your publications, view your H-index, analyse your author output (according to documents by source and type, by subject, co-authors and citations).

It is worth linking your Scopus Author Profile to your ORCID.

If your profile is incorrect:

If you have more author profiles, or there are publications in your profile that don't belong to you, you can ask Scopus to correct them.

To do it use the [Request author detail corrections](#) link or the [Scopus Author Feedback Wizard](#). Corrections are usually done within 2-4 weeks.
