Second-year student **Erna Uricska** compiled a unique, English-language dictionary on Covid-related terms and expressions: URICSKA, ERNA (2021). *Covidictionary. Words and phrases related to the global pandemic*. Budapest: Rejtjel Kiadó.

Erna Uricska is an ESP teacher at the Department of Foreign Languages for Specific Purposes, Faculty of Law Enforcement, University of Public Service in Budapest. She is also a PhD student in the Doctoral School of Sociology and Communication Science, Corvinus University of Budapest. Her research interest focuses on digital communication and its special features.

The coronavirus pandemic that appeared in Hungary in the Spring of 2020 has almost completely changed our lives. And since it has affected all areas of our lives, why would it have left the use of language untouched?

This monolingual collection of expressions contains the most common words and phrases in use between March and September 2020, including several newly-coined words, so-called neologisms. Using one of these, I named the genre 'covidocs' not only because this name might fit better than the word 'dictionary', but also due to the fact that the majority of the corpus is made up of the terminology that is used by those working in the frontline fighting against the coronavirus, for example in law enforcement and health care.

I am grateful to my doctoral supervisor, Ágnes Veszelszki. Her Hungarian 'Karanténszótár' (Quarantine Dictionary) is the first example of this new genre. I am also grateful to Katalin Molnár, who would never discourage me from realizing my ideas. I would also like to thank my colleagues at the University of Public Service. This compilation would not have been possible without their support.
